

BY-LAWS

of the

Sunwheelers Chapter of FMCA

(organized)

1-25-74

- Sec. 1 DUTIES OF DIRECTORS. The affairs of the organization shall be managed by the Board of Directors.
- Sec. 2 DUTIES OF PRESIDENT. The President of this organization shall preside at all meetings and appoint committee chairman for all functions.
- Sec. 3 DUTIES OF VICE PRESIDENT. In the absence of the President, the Vice President shall perform the duties of the President.
- Sec. 4 DUTIES OF SECRETARY. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings, send out all notices prescribed by the President and perform the usual duties of a Secretary.
- Sec. 5 DUTIES OF TREASURER. The Treasurer shall receive and keep a record of all monies received by the organization and shall pay out such monies for the organization as shall be directed by the proper authorities, he shall render financial condition at each regular meeting.
- Sec. 6 DUES. The dues in this organization shall be FIVE DOLLARS (\$5.00) per year, payable January 1, each year. Any change in the amount of dues must be approved by simple majority of membership.
- Sec. 7 CHARTER MEMBERS. There shall be no initiation fee for any new members joining this organization before July 1, 1974, and all members of this organization on July 1, 1974 shall be considered Charter Members.
- Sec. 8 REMOVAL OF OFFICER. The Board may remove any officer by a majority vote at any time with just cause, all vacancies in any office shall be filled by the Board of Directors without undue delay, at its regular meeting, or at a meeting specially called for that purpose.
- Sec. 9 QUORUM. A quorum necessary for the transaction of any business at the Board of Directors meeting shall be at least three (3), members of the board.
- Sec. 10 MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS. There shall be no residential requirements to membership in this organization and members of this organization may also be members of other chapters of Family Motor Coach Association, Inc.

Sec. 11 DELINQUENT DUES. Any member delinquent in his dues for more than 90 days after January 1, each year shall be considered not in good standing and loses his voting rights.

Sec. 12 IDENTIFICATION PLAQUE, ETC. The Board of Directors are authorized to establish a suitable identification plaque, plate, sticker or flag to be carried upon members coaches and make them available to members.

Sec. 13 AMENDMENT TO THE BY LAWS. Any member desiring to propose an amendment to the By Laws may do so by submitting the proposed amendment in writing to the Board of Directors, and voted upon by the membership at the next meeting.

Sec. 14 TO HOLD OFFICE. To hold office of President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, one must live in the boundries of the chapter.

Sec. 15 No officer of this chapter may hold office in any other chapter at the same time.

Sec. 16 APPLICANT. Any applicant may be recommended by any member of this chapter, attend one meeting, then be approved by membership.


December Rally!

**BYLAWS
SUNWHEELERS CHAPTER OF FMCA**

ARTICLE I

The name of this organization shall be Sunwheelers Chapter, Family Motor Coach Association (**FMCA**). The purpose of the chapter is to promote good camping practices and good fellowship among fellow motor coach owners.

ARTICLE II
ADOPTION OF FMCA CONSTITUTION,
BYLAWS, AND CODE OF ETHICS

The FMCA Constitution, Bylaws, and Code of Ethics contained therein are herewith adopted in their entirety, insofar as they may reasonably apply to Sunwheelers Chapter. The supplemental bylaws contained herein shall define only the operation of the Sunwheelers Chapter, and only to the extent that such supplemental bylaws are not inconsistent with the FMCA Constitution and Bylaws.

ARTICLE III
MEMBERSHIP

Section 1 - Member

- A. The term "member" as used herein, is defined: as a family unit consisting of husband and wife with or without children, or an adult person with or without children.
- B. Full member is defined as: coach owner and/or coach owner and spouse (limited to two [2] per coach.)
- C. Family member is defined as: dependent children of full member.
- D. 1) Members
 - (a) Shall have one vote each on all matters to come before the membership.
 - (b) Will pay annual dues as outlined in E. 1).
 - (c) May hold office in the Chapter.

BYLAWS-Sunwheelers
Article III - continued

2) Family Members

Have all rights and privileges of full members except they may not:

- (a) Hold office;
- (b) Hold rallies;
- (c) Vote on any issue before the organization;
- (d) Be assessed for annual coach dues;
- (e) Be eligible to participate in organization activities at reduced rates provided for full members.

E. Annual Dues

- 1) \$10.00 per coach (Dues are due January 1 of each year.)
- 2) No other dues or assessments to be collected by Treasurer except membership assessment as outlined in Standing Rules.

Section 2 - Charter Members

This Chapter was organized on January 25, 1974 and Chartered April 26, 1974. All members of this organization as of July 1, 1974, shall be considered Charter Members.

Section 3 - New Members

- A. There shall be no residential requirements for membership.
- B. To become a member an applicant must:
 - 1) Have attended one rally with the Sunwheelers as a visitor;
 - 2) Be a member in good standing of FMCA or have made application therefor and have received a copy of the Sunwheelers' Bylaws;
 - 3) Must submit a signed Chapter application accompanied by the initiation fee as outlined in Standing Rules to cover badges, bylaws, registration, etc.
- C. The application shall be presented to the members at the next rally. The application must be approved by a majority of members present and voting. The applicant will not be in the immediate area of the voting.

Section 4 - Duties of Chapter Members

The Chapter members shall abide by the FMCA Constitution, Bylaws, Code of Ethics, and the Chapter Bylaws. Members shall familiarize themselves with chapter operation and cast their votes in chapter elections. (One vote for each adult member with a limit of two votes per family unit.)

Section 5 - Removal from Membership

- A. A member who has not paid dues by February 1 shall lose voting rights. The member must pay dues within 60 days from January 1 or will be considered to have forfeited membership and will be dropped from roll of Sunwheelers.

BYLAWS-Sunwheelers
Article III - continued

B. A membership may be withdrawn by the Chapter's Executive Board for violation of the FMCA Constitution, Bylaws, or Code of Ethics, or for violation of the Chapter Bylaws. Before such action is taken the member must be notified in writing of his alleged infraction of the rules and the date that he may appear before the committee so that he may be given an opportunity for atonement.

C. Any member failing to be a Rallymaster, at the President's request, may be removed from membership upon vote of all members.

ARTICLE IV
OFFICERS

Section 1 - Executive Committee

Shall consist of the Immediate Past President and the Chapter Officers which are the President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer.

Section 2 - Executive Board

Shall consist of all members of the Executive Committee plus four other elected Board members.

Section 3 - FMCA Governing Board Representatives

Shall consist of a National Director and Alternate National Director.

Section 4 - Election of Officers

A. A Nominating Committee will be solicited from the floor and elected by the Chapter membership not later than 60 days prior to the election of officers. Their term of office shall expire on December 31.

B. The Nominating Committee will present a slate of officers to the Chapter Secretary for mailing to the Chapter membership in the August newsletter. Any member may make nominations from the floor at the August rally. Nominee must be willing to serve.

C. Ballots will be included in the September newsletter. Election will be conducted at the November rally.

D. Election of officers with opposition will be by secret ballot.

Section 5 - Terms of Office

A. Terms of office for Chapter Officers, National Director and Alternate National Director shall be for one year. Officers may not serve more than three consecutive terms in the same office.

BYLAWS-Sunwheelers
Article IV - continued

B. Terms of office for Executive Board members (less the Executive Committee) shall be staggered; two for four years and two for two years.

Section 6 - Eligibility to Hold Office

To hold any office, the candidates must be a member in good standing of Sunwheelers Chapter. An officer may not hold any elected office in any other Chapter of FMCA concurrently.

Section 7 - Duties of Officers

Duties of officers are as stated in Article XV, FMCA Bylaws, plus the following additional duties:

- A. President - Presides at Chapter membership meetings, serves as Chairperson of the Executive Committee and the Executive Board. Appoints a Rallymaster for each rally.
- B. Vice President - Presides in the absence of the President.
- C. Secretary - Obtains information on upcoming rallies from Rallymasters and publishes same to the Chapter membership and FMCA, time permitting.
- D. Treasurer - Collect dues and dispense money. Any expenditure of over \$100.00 which will not be reimbursed by dinner assessments, parking fees, etc., must be approved by the membership.
- E. Executive Board Members - The affairs of the Sunwheelers Chapter shall be managed by the Executive Board. Any five members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
- F. National Director and Alternate National Director - As stated in FMCA Constitution and Bylaws.

Section 8 - Removal from Office

The Executive Board may remove any officer for just cause after first notifying such officer in writing of action pending against him. Vacancies thus created must be filled by the Chapter membership from nominations by the Nominating Committee and/or the Chapter membership at large.

Article V

ARTICLE V
RALLIES

Section 1 - Meetings

When there is business to be conducted it will normally be done at meetings held during rallies. A quorum for transaction of business at any duly called Chapter meeting is 25% of the Chapter family unit membership or 15 family unit members, whichever is less.

Section 2 - Duties of the Rallymaster

- A. Select a suitable rally site and make reservations and/or cash deposits. The Rallymaster may require those desiring to attend to make a deposit to him since deposits are not usually reimbursable if the member fails to attend.
- B. Give all the information pertaining to the upcoming rally to the Chapter Secretary so that it may be published to the Chapter membership.
- C. Aid incoming Chapter members with selecting a site, particularly after dark.
- D. Rally Expenses
 - 1) Present bills to the Treasurer for payment covering coffee and continental breakfast supplies as outlined in Standing Rules.
 - 2) Advise members, thru monthly newsletter, of any expenses involved in rally dinner and collect same on a prorated basis unless prior arrangements have been made, such as D. 3).
 - 3) Present costs for meats, decorations, gifts, prizes, etc., to the Treasurer for reimbursement as authorized by membership vote should expenses exceed \$100.00, such as Christmas, Thanksgiving, Halloween, etc., parties and/or dinners.
 - 4) Cost of guest breakfast and dinners at the discretion of Rallymaster as outlined in Standing Rules.
- E. Serve as Sergeant at Arms for the rally period to assist the Chapter Officers in the maintenance of good order, and to report to the Chapter President any unresolved violation of rules (by Chapter members or others) that adversely affects other Chapter members; such as, persons not observing the late evening quiet hours as shown in the rally site park rules, persons not keeping their pets on a leash and excluded from eating areas.
(Article IV, FMCA Bylaws - Code of Ethics)

Article V - continued

Section 3 - Selection of Rallymaster

- A. Voluntary basis;
- B. In absence of volunteers, President will appoint at his discretion per Article IV, Section 7, A;
- C. It is anticipated that each member coach will volunteer no less than once every two years.

ARTICLE VI
IDENTIFICATION

The Executive Board is authorized to establish a suitable identification plaque, plate, sticker, and/or flag for display on members' person and/or coaches. There shall be no penalty for failure to display such a device.

ARTICLE VII
PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Roberts Rules of Order shall prevail on all subjects not covered by these Bylaws.

ARTICLE VIII
AMENDMENTS TO THE BYLAWS

Any member desiring to propose an amendment to the Bylaws may do so by submitting such proposal in writing to the Executive Board. Such proposal will be screened for legality, published in the newsletter, and put before the membership for a vote at the following meeting.

STANDING RULES

Standing Rules shall be a part of the Sunwheelers Chapter and will be administered as outlined in Article XVIII (Parliamentary Rules & Procedures) of the FMCA Constitution and Bylaws, Paragraph 3 which states:

"Standing Rules may be adopted, suspended, modified or rescinded in any meeting by majority vote of those present. Such Rules shall not be interpreted or used so as to limit, suspend or deny any specific rights granted to members under these Bylaws."

BYLAWS-Sunwheelers
Standing Rules - continued

- A. Membership assessments shall be due and payable January 1 of each year.
- 1) Each member (including Full Members and Family Members) shall be assessed \$7.50 per person per year. This assessment shall be paid at the same time as Annual Coach dues are paid. The same time limitations as outlined in Article III, Section 5 of the Bylaws shall apply. Children under three years of age will be exempt from membership assessment.
- B. Rally Expenses
- 1) Continental Breakfast is interpreted to mean fruit or juice; rolls (sweet or plain) or toast and beverage (coffee or tea). Any other expenses incurred will be assessed to the members attending. Notice of such assessment should appear in the newsletter.
 - 2) Guests may be charged at the rate designated by the Rallymaster. It is the responsibility of the member inviting guests to arrange payment to Rallymaster. Rallymaster will report monies collected to Treasurer and subtract this amount from outstanding bills.
- C. Deaths and Illnesses
- 1) Death of a Full Member shall be recognized by flowers or appropriate memorial not to exceed \$50.00.
 - 2) Death of a Family Member shall be recognized by a card or letter.
 - 3) Illness or injury of any member causing hospital or house confinement will be recognized by a card. It is the duty of each member to report knowledge of the above to the Sunshine Chairman.
- D. Treasury Balance
- The officers and members shall endeavor to have a minimum balance of \$100.00 in the treasury at the end of each fiscal year to provide for the smooth transition of officers.
- E. Initiation Fees
- The initiation fee of \$15.00 for couples and \$8.00 for single adults shall be paid at the time of application for membership.
- F. Up to two (2) family units shall be credited with a rally.

As Chairmen of the Historical Committee, we wanted to take this opportunity to update all chapters in regard to the particulars of YOUR chapter display at our upcoming SILVER ANNIVERSARY CONVENTION, July 19 - 21, 1988, at South Bend, Indiana.

We realize that much of this information is going to be repetitious, however, since this is a "first" for FMCA, new questions keep arising which we feel should be addressed.

I have attached a listing of all the Area Historians with their addresses and telephone numbers (if available) for your information. This, of course, is your contact person and if you have any questions after reading this letter, please feel free to contact them.

First of all, we would like to remind everyone that all chapters interested in having a chapter history display at the SILVER ANNIVERSARY CONVENTION, should notify their Area Historian of their intentions as soon as possible, but no later than July 1, 1988. This will assure you a reserved 4' X 4' display board which will have your chapter name at the top.

1. Participating chapters will be provided a 4' X 4' free-standing styrofoam-covered peg-board section for their historical display.
2. Participating chapters should have a logo or chapter insignia, approximately 15 inches by 15 inches, to be mounted with their display.
3. Each participating chapter is expected to have its display prepared and ready for easy mounting on Monday, July 18, 1988. It is suggested that chapters use push pins for easy mounting on the styrofoam-covered display boards. Please bring all materials necessary for mounting your display.
4. One person should be designated by each chapter to be responsible for the display.

continued

5. All materials on display should be donated, as they may not be returned. Any pictures or articles you want to save, please have a duplicate made for the display board. Security for items displayed cannot be guaranteed. The person who you designate to be responsible for your display, would also be responsible for dismantling and removing your display on Friday morning, July 22, 1988, between 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m.

6. Your chapter may be notified while at the convention that the National Historical Committee would like to take some items of interest back to the FMCA National office for FMCA's permanent archives. Such items will be marked with stickers before your chapter dismantles on Friday morning. The Historical Committee will be on hand between 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. Friday morning to collect these items.

As Edith Langdon, Southeast Area Historian, stated in her letter to the Southeast Area Chapters,

"Keep in mind that as viewers stroll by these displays, their time available for each one will necessarily be limited. This means that a simple, attractive, but pertinent exhibit will be better received than one filled with much small detail. Also to be considered, is the matter of portability (transporting the display to the convention) resistance to handling, damage and the desirability of the display being sufficient unto itself without the necessity of attendants or watch dogs being present."

Again, please contact YOUR Area Historian and let them know before July 1, 1988, if your chapter plans to display or not. It is the Area Historian's responsibility to inform Genny Jennings of the name of each participating chapter by July 1, 1988, so that chapter display boards can be obtained, set-up and waiting at the convention site for chapters to set-up.

Thanks to everyone in advance for helping us obtain the archives of our Association and if you have any questions, please feel free to contact your Area Historian.
